

What is an IEP Goal?

IEP goals or objectives represent a part of a required fluency or list of skills that describe what a student should accomplish during the school year (IEP cycle). Each objective in the IEP goal progression moves the learner through previously unmastered skills and skill gaps that may span multiple grade levels or be more condensed to a specific grade or developmental range.

Teach Tastic IEP goals written to be SMART: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Results-oriented and Time-bound.

Objectives

Letter identification: Identify frequently confused letters

By (date), when given a list of frequently confused letters and the letters read to them, the student will choose the letter that they hear, improving reading foundations skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.

Letter identification: Choose the uppercase letter that you hear

By (date), when given a uppercase letter identification chart with letters read to them, the student will choose the letter that they hear with 80% accuracy, improving reading foundations skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.

Letter identification: Choose the lower case letter that you hear

By (date), when given a lowercase letter identification chart with letters read to them, the student will choose the letter that they hear with 80% accuracy, improving reading foundations skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.

Letter identification: Find letters in the alphabet

By (date), when given a capital letter identification chart, the student will identify capital letters with 80% accuracy, improving reading foundations skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.
