

What is an IEP Goal?

IEP goals or objectives represent a part of a required fluency or list of skills that describe what a student should accomplish during the school year (IEP cycle). Each objective in the IEP goal progression moves the learner through previously unmastered skills and skill gaps that may span multiple grade levels or be more condensed to a specific grade or developmental range.

Determine the order of events in informational texts

By (date), when given an event timeline, the student will determine the order of events in informational texts, improving reading strategies skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.

Main idea: Determine the main idea of a passage

By (date), when given a short passage at reading level, the student will determine the main idea of a passage, improving reading strategies skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.

Main idea: Use key details to determine the main idea

By (date), when given a short paragraph, the student will use key details to determine the main idea, improving reading strategies skills from 0/10 work samples out of ten consecutive trials to 8/10 work samples in ten consecutive trials.
