Lesson Plan

Verbs - Finding action verbs

Kindergarten (K) - ELA

LEARNING TARGET

• Students will be able to identify the difference between a noun and a verb by selecting the verb from a word pair including one noun.

MATERIALS

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Review with students that words can be sorted into different groups based on their meaning.
- 2. Introduce the concepts of nouns and verbs.
- 3. Show word and picture cards to demonstrate examples of each.

INSTRUCTION

- 1. Review the word pairs on the board, which include a noun and a verb.
- 2. Explain to students that they will be selecting the verb from each word pair.
- 3. Go over examples of each type of word pair together.

GUIDED PRACTICE

- 1. Divide the class into pairs.
- 2. Provide each pair with word and picture cards and ask them to select the verb from each word pair.
- 3. Circulate around the room to provide support and guidance as needed.

INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

- 1. Instruct students to work independently to select the verb from each word pair.
- 2. Monitor students' progress and provide support as needed.

HOMEWORK

- 1. Assign students to find and write down 5 nouns and 5 verbs from their daily life.
- 2. Encourage students to bring their list to share with the class during the next lesson.

EXIT TICKET

- 1. Provide each student with a whiteboard and marker.
- 2. Instruct students to write a sentence using one noun and one verb.

SUMMATIVE

- 1. Formative assessments will be conducted during the lesson to monitor students' understanding of nouns and verbs.
- 2. The exit ticket and progress monitoring assessments will be used to determine students' mastery of selecting the verb from a word pair.

CLOSING

- 1. Review the concept of nouns and verbs with students.
- 2. Ask students to share one sentence they wrote using a noun and a verb during the lesson.

TEACHING TIPS

- Use clear and concise language when explaining the difference between nouns and verbs to students.
- Provide multiple examples of nouns and verbs and encourage students to identify them.
- Incorporate interactive activities such as games or group work to help reinforce the concept.

MISCONCEPTIONS

- Students may confuse adjectives with verbs and vice versa. It is important to clarify the difference between the two.
- Some students may struggle with identifying verbs that are not actions, such as "is" or "am". Be sure to provide examples of these types of verbs.
- Students may have difficulty identifying verbs when they are paired with a noun in a sentence. Encourage them to focus on the action in the sentence to determine the verb.

EXTENSION

- 1. Students can practice identifying adjectives and adverbs from word pairs.
- 2. Students can create their own word pairs and challenge a partner to select the verb.

INTERVENTION

- 1. For students who struggle with fine motor skills, larger word and picture cards can be used.
- 2. For students who need extra support, a visual aid or diagram can be provided to help them understand the concept of nouns and verbs.
