Lesson Plan

Read-along informational texts - Shared reading - food

Kindergarten (K) - ELA

LEARNING TARGET

- Students will identify the main topic of a text about food.
- Students will retell key details of the text by answering questions.
- Students will listen actively to the passage.

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Display the picture book and ask students what they think it might be about.
- 2. Introduce the vocabulary words.

INSTRUCTION

- 1. Read the book aloud, stopping occasionally to ask questions about the main topic and key details.
- 2. Model retelling key details by summarizing what you just read.
- Discuss what the main topic of the text is.

GUIDED PRACTICE

- 1. Divide students into small groups and provide each group with a copy of the book.
- 2. Instruct students to read the book together and discuss the main topic and key details.
- 3. Circulate around the room to provide support and guidance as needed.

INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

- 1. Instruct students to choose a different book about food and read it independently.
- 2. Instruct students to write down the main topic and at least three key details from the text.
- 3. Monitor students' progress and provide support as needed.

HOMEWORK

- 1. Have students select a book or article about food to read with a parent or caregiver.
- 2. After reading, ask the student to identify the main topic of the text and retell key details.
- 3. Provide a list of questions related to the text and have the student answer them orally or in writing.
- 4. Encourage students to share their reading experience and key details with the class during the next lesson.

EXIT TICKET

- 1. Provide each student with a whiteboard and marker.
- 2. Instruct students to write down the main topic of the book they read and one key detail.

SUMMATIVE

- 1. Formative assessments will be conducted during the lesson to monitor students' understanding of identifying the main topic and key details of a text about food.
- 2. The exit ticket and progress monitoring assessments will be used to determine students' mastery of the skill.

CLOSING

- 1. Ask students to share one key detail they learned about food from the book they read.
- 2. Review the importance of understanding the main topic and key details of a text.

TEACHING TIPS

- 1. Use visual aids to help students understand the text.
- 2. Provide plenty of opportunities for discussion and questioning.
- 3. Use real-world examples to make the lesson more relatable.

MISCONCEPTIONS

- 1. Confusing main topic with details.
- 2. Focusing too much on minor details instead of the main topic.
- 3. Difficulty comprehending complex texts.

EXTENSION

- 1. Students can create their own book about food, including the main topic and key details.
- 2. Students can write a paragraph summarizing the book they read.

INTERVENTION

- 1. For students who struggle with reading, provide a simplified version of the book or use picture cues to help them understand.
- 2. For students who need extra support, provide a graphic organizer to help them identify the main topic and key details of the text.
